The university timeline

King Phillip of Shain, with the support of Pope Pius IV, founds the Douai Faculty of Law, consisting of two law faculties (canon law and civil law). In 1895, the Faculty of Law is transferred from Douai to Lille.

Four faculties are merged:
letters, sciences, law and medicine,
making Lille the largest university
centre in Northern France. Louis
Pasteur is the 1st dean of the Faculty
of Science.

The universities Lille 1 Sciences and Technologies, Lille 2 Law and Health and Lille 3 Human and Social Sciences merge to create the University of Lille.

The University of Lille is awarded the Excellence Initiative label for its internationally recognized research and academic programmes.

It welcomes four *Grandes écoles*: Lille School of Journalism, SciencesPo Lille, ENSAPL and ENSAIT.







The Maison internationale

The Maison internationale is a place of welcome for international students at the University. The staff welcomes them and guides them through the administrative procedures related to their stay in France, starting even before their arrival in Lille. To prepare before leaving home, students can download two mobile applications (ULillGo and ULillExplore) that provide a wealth of information. The Maison Internationale also houses a Campus France office and a Euraxess centre, a European programme to welcome international researchers.

Once in Lille, students are invited to participate in many free events to help get settled, to discover the rich culture of Lille and the north of France. Thanks to these programmes, the university has obtained the *Bienvenue en France* label, which recognizes the quality of our programmes for welcoming international students and staff.

- NeurotechEU European University of Brain and Technology: Its objective is to build a trans-European alliance of excellence in neuroscience research and related technologies in order to increase the competitiveness of teaching and research.
- 3i University Network: The 3i Network is a crossborder collaboration founded by Ghent University, KU Leuven, the University of Kent and the University of Lille. The aim of the network is to bring together universities, regional governments, the private sector and civil society to work on common challenges in their shared region.


